# Checking if a website is real or fake can be tricky, but you can help your child do it!

# Here are my top 10 suggestions



#### Look at the website address:

Check the website's address (URL). Watch out for misspelt words or strange things in the address.



#### Check for https:// and $\mathbf{\hat{n}}$ :

Genuine websites start with https:// and have a padlock symbol. It means the site is safe and secure.



#### See how the website looks:

Genuine websites look well-organised and professional. If a website looks unprofessional or messy, it might be fake.

### Check the writing:

Real websites feature text without mistakes. If the text is badly written or has errors, it might be fake.



#### Find contact information:

Genuine websites have ways to contact the organisation, e.g. an email address or phone number. If there is no contact info, be careful!



#### Check on social media:

You can find most real websites on social media. Look for their pages on Facebook, Instagram or X.

#### Check the information on other sites:

Search for the same information on other trusted websites. If it matches, it is likely to be real.

#### **Check for reviews:**

Look for reviews about the organisation from others. If there are no reviews or they look made up, be careful.



#### Be careful with pop-ups and pushy language:

Many fake websites may have annoying pop-up ads and use words to push you into things. Real sites are more respectful.



#### Shop safely:

When shopping online, use well-known websites or official brand sites. Avoid strange deals that seem too good to be true.

Remember, if a website seems strange or doesn't feel right, take your time and check before you trust it. It's like being a detective to keep safe online!
