

## Useful links for parents and carers – Reporting

<p><a href="#">CEOP</a></p>	<p>CEOP is a law enforcement agency and, helping keep children and young people safe from sexual exploitation and abuse online. This reporting feature should be used if you feel your children has been groomed or exploited online.</p>
<p><a href="#">Childline Report Remove</a></p>	<p>A service designed to support parents and children if intimate images have been shared online</p>
<p><a href="#">Report Harmful Content</a></p>	<p>Report Harmful Content has 2 main functions:</p> <p>Advice: Empowering anyone who has come across harmful content online to report it by providing up to date information on community standards and direct links to the correct reporting facilities across multiple platforms.</p> <p>Reporting: Providing further support to users over the age of 13 who have already submitted a report to industry and would like outcomes reviewed. Report Harmful Content will check submitted reports and industry responses against platform-specific reporting procedures and community standards in order to provide users with further advice on actions they can take.</p>
